



- US exports to China since 2000 have grown at a significantly faster rate than US exports to any other major export market. Electrical machinery and equipment, power generation equipment, medical instruments, plastics, aircraft, iron and steel, waste and scrap, and agricultural products were among the largest US exports to China.
- The next-fastest-growing major export market for US products over the past eight years was Belgium, with fuel oil, dairy and eggs, and corn among the key export products.
- Growth to the other top US export markets in the 2000-2007 period—Canada, Mexico, Japan, and the United Kingdom—has been significantly slower. In Japan's case, exports have actually declined since 2000.
